Blackhawk Band Festival

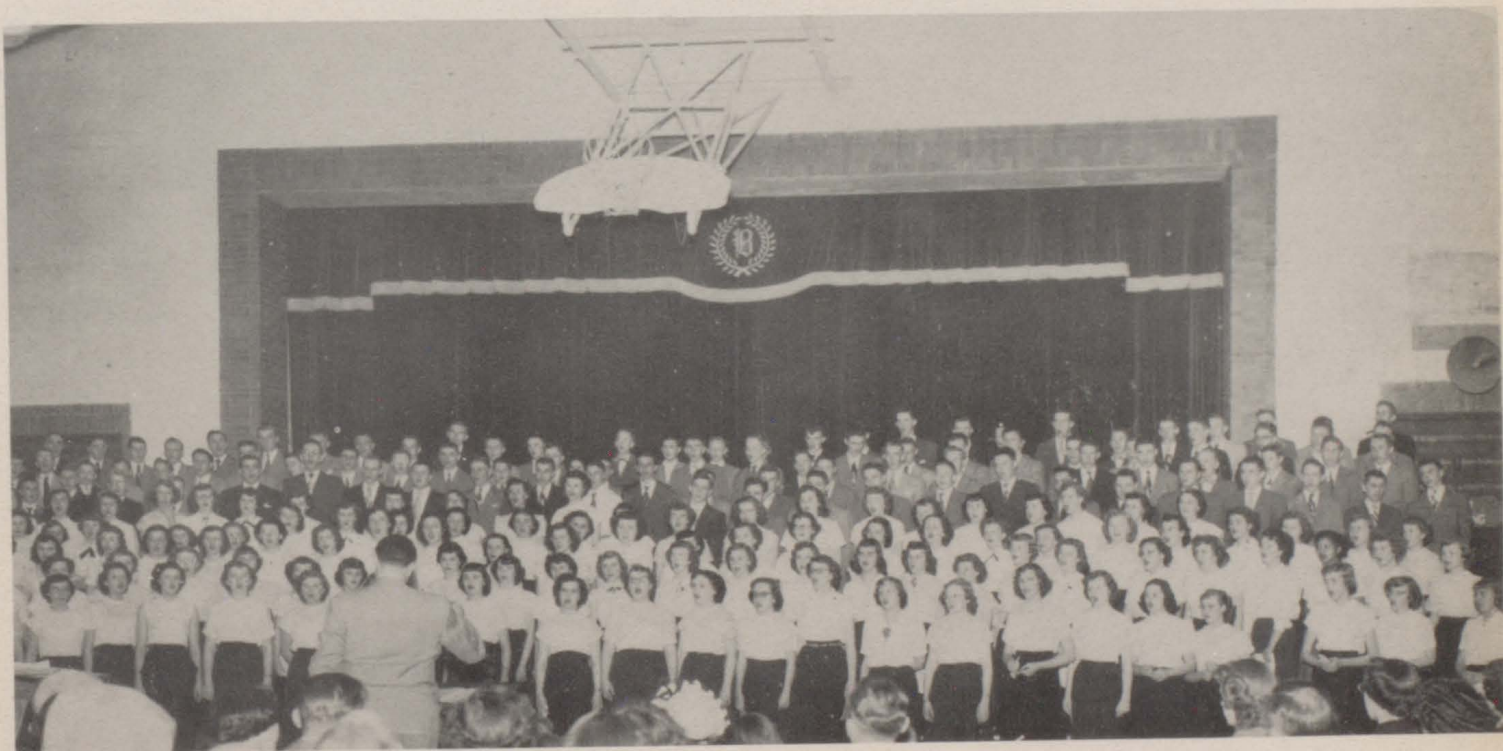
