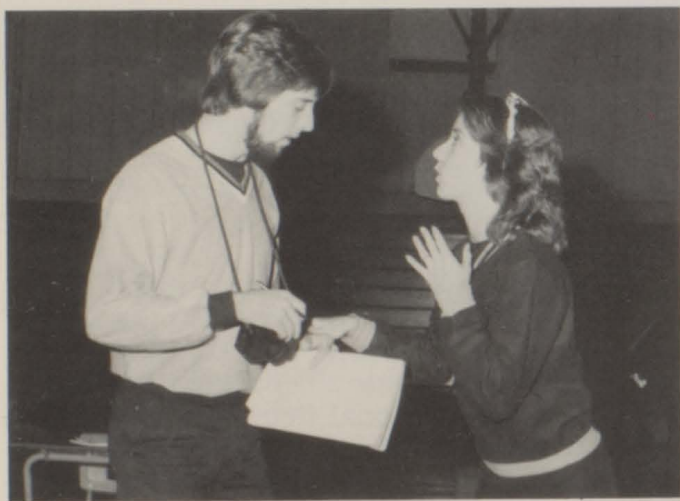

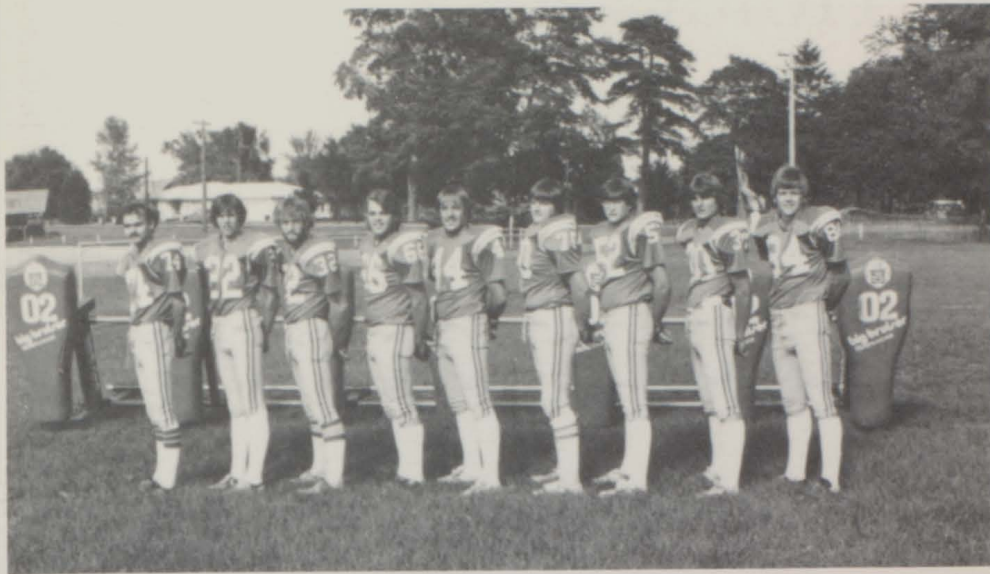
The Wildcats plunged into the 1980 Football Season with eight returning lettermen and an enthusiastic attitude that was tough to beat.

The 1980-81 Galva Basketball season began on an inspiring note with a defeat against rival Wethersfield, 40-38.

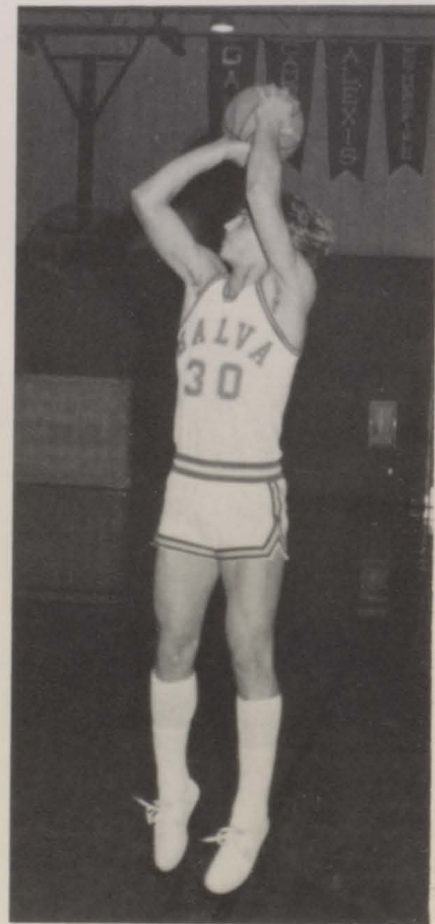

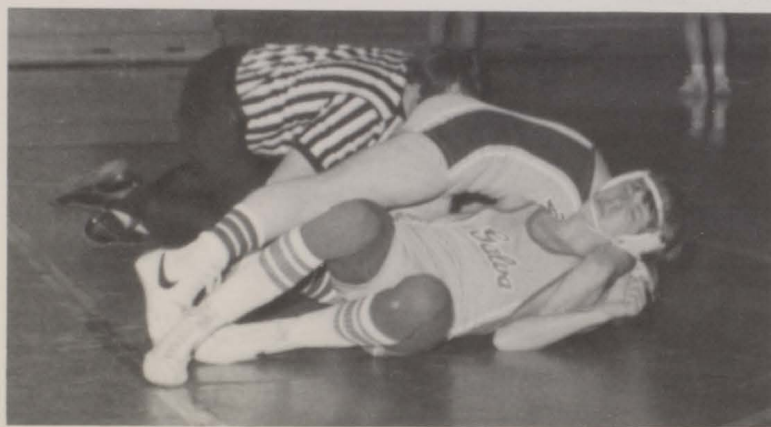

With most of the squad members returning, the team is thinking positively toward next year's season.



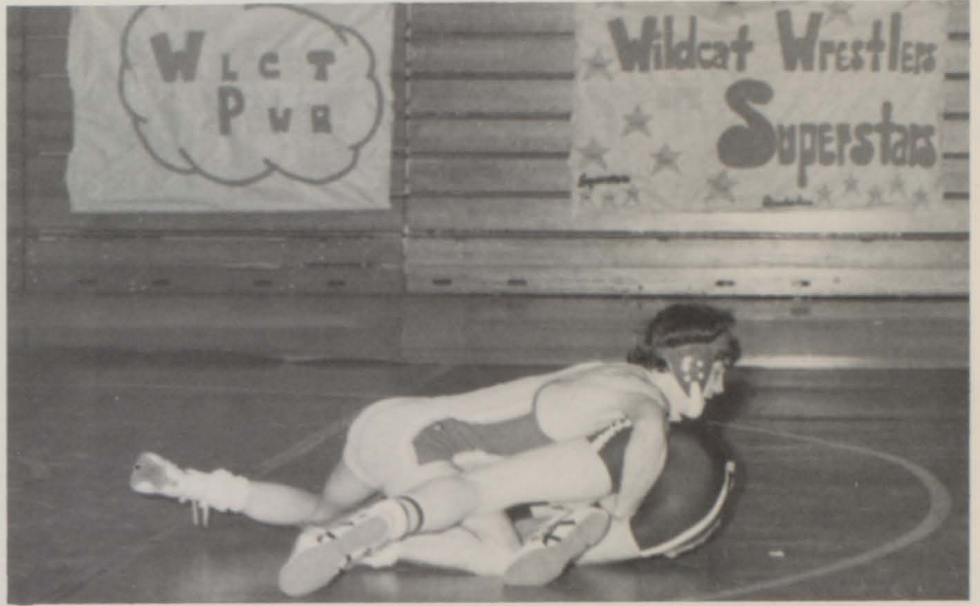

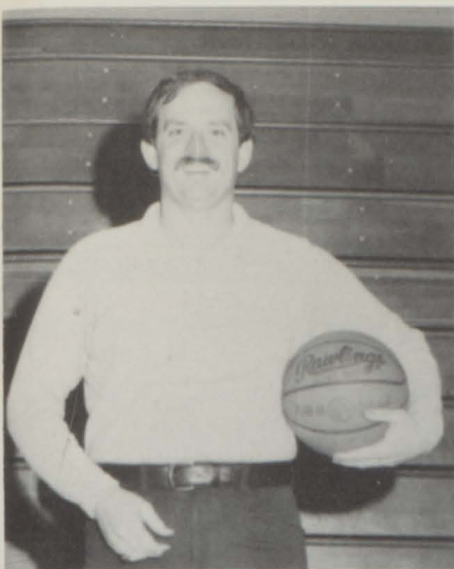

The winner receives a certificate and a book.

## Stacey Collis Richard Freece Award

The "Richard Freece Award" was established in 1931 by Mrs. E. L. Yocum in memory of Richard Freece who drowned his junior year in high school. This award is given each year to a senior boy who has shown himself to be the best all-around student in scholarship and has been active in high school activities. He must have a 4.0 average or above by the end of his Sophomore year. The winner receives \$100, a gold key, and his name placed on a plaque in the trophy case.

The gift is \$100 and the recipient is responsible for reporting to the Women's Club of Galva personally or by letter.

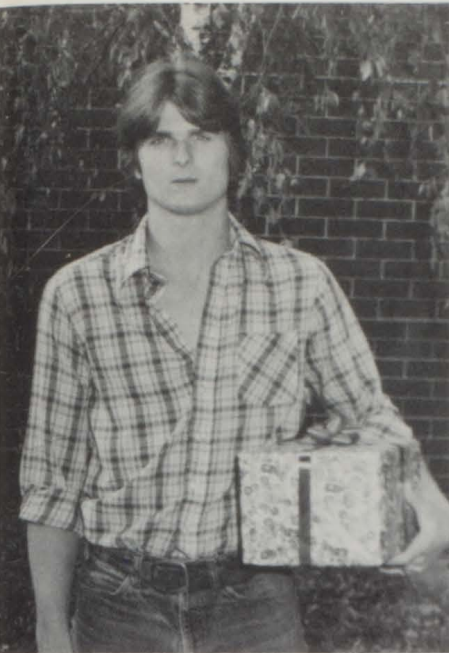

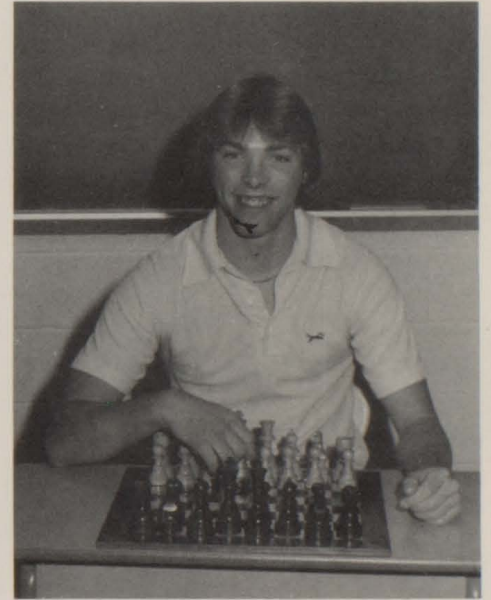

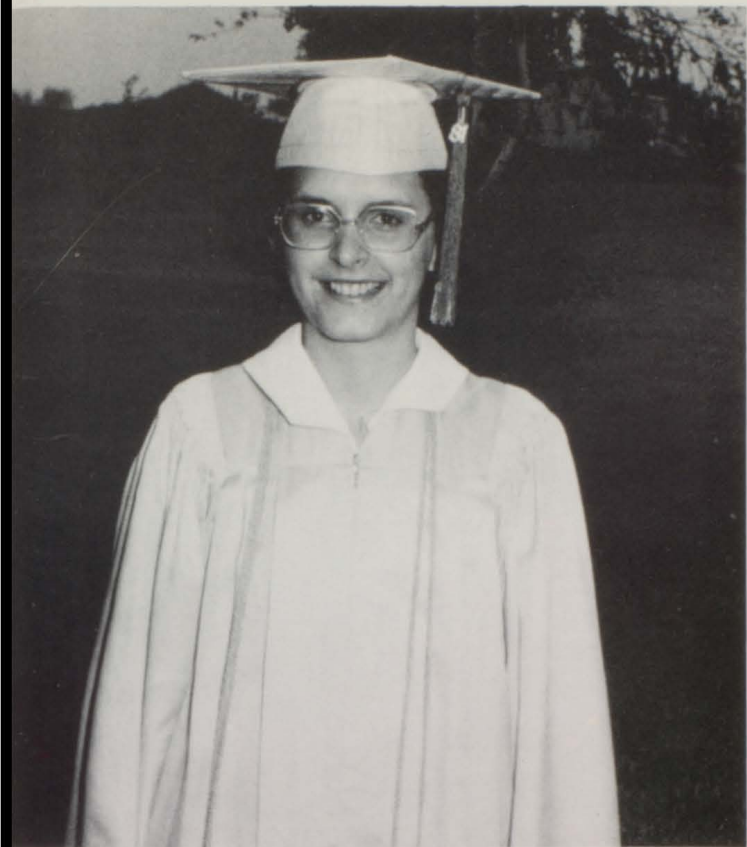

# Foreign Students Keep Fond Memories



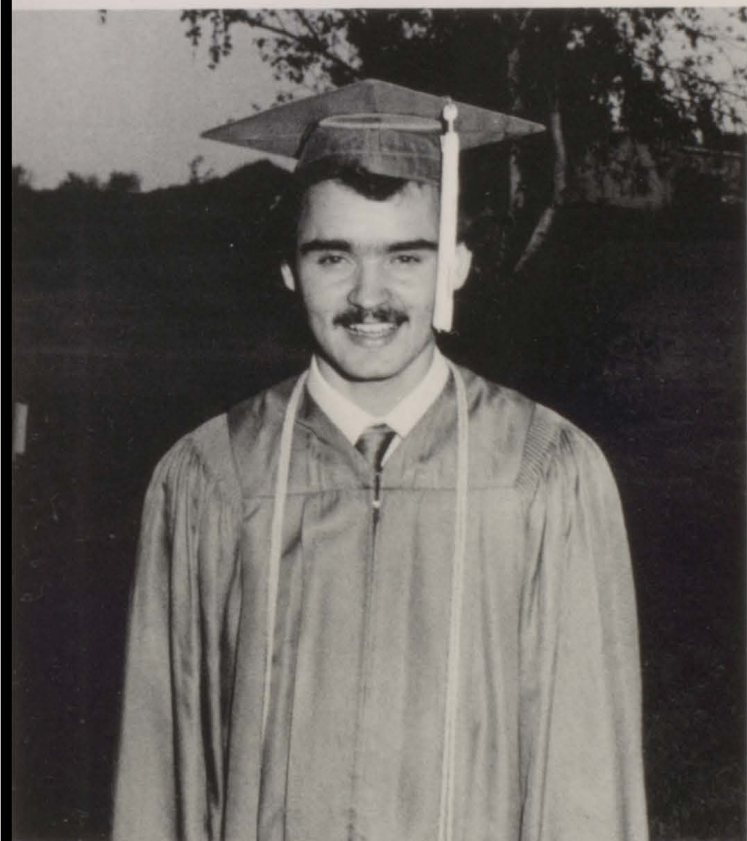
## Pilar Pedraza
